Changes to the Regular Trash Pick-Up Days for 2024

 Tuesday, September 3-will be moved to Wednesday, September 4 (Labor Day Holiday)

To help accommodate the large quantity of yardwaste in the spring, the City of Omaha (City) provides a collection window when unlimited paper yardwaste bags will be collected and stickers will not be required on the bags. Bundles of brush will be required to be stickered even during these times. Bags of yardwaste collected during this time will be composted to make Oma-Gro compost.

The dates of the Spring unlimited yardwaste collection are May 6-June 14.

All yardwaste for this collection period must be in paper yardwaste bags. No plastic bags, no trash cans, no bundles of brush will be picked up during this period. You may use your regular black lid waste cart for yardwaste at the same time; however material in the waste cart will not be composted.

Entrance Island Renovations Completed at 144 and Harvey Oaks Avenue

The 144 and Harvey Oaks Avenue entrance island renovation project has been completed. The revenue from the 2022 and 2023 Harvey Oaks Golf Classic financed this undertaking.

The proceeds from 2024 Golf Classic will be put toward the renovation of the 148 Street entrance islands. This is just another example of HOHA working to improve your neighborhood.

Youth Emergency Services (YES) Selected at HOHA's Designated Charity

YES will receive 20% of the total revenue from the Silent Auction at the End of Summer Bash/Picnic.

- The mission of YES is to serve homeless and at-risk youth by providing critically needed resources which empower them to become self-sufficient.
- · The programs of YES include the following.
- Street Outreach-YES outreach workers hit the streets, searching for youth in crisis. Team members invite youth ages, 12 to 21, to the Street Outreach Center where they can have a warm meal, take a shower, and access other support services.
- Transitional Living-Provides long-term services to homeless youth, ages 16 to 21. Youth reside in apartment-style living for a maximum of 18 months and work closely with transition advocates to set and accomplish goals that empower them to be self-sufficient.
- Emergency Shelter-A family-style residence with separate sleeping areas for male and female youth, ages 16 to 20.
 Youth can stay up to three weeks. Trained staff assists youth in developing a plan to address their immediate situation.
- Maternity Home-Provides long-term services to pregnant or parenting mothers, ages 16-21. Young moms live in a familystyle residence for a maximum of 18 months and work closely with transition advocates to set and accomplish goals.

Notice to Residents

Posting Signs in the Entrance Islands

Residents are asked NOT to place signs in the entrance islands advertising different events. The signs break the landscaping fabric and allow weeds to grow in the islands.

Cars Parked on Neighborhood Streets

for an extended period of time


According to the City of Omaha's Code of Ordinance, section 36-161, cars can't be parked on residential streets without movement for 48 hours.

Sec. 36-161. - Storage of cars on street. No person shall park a vehicle continuously in one place in the same block for a period in excess of 48 hours on any street, and any vehicle parked in violation of this section is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.

If cars are parked for extended periods of time, this causes traffic problems and the streets can't be cleaned of snow properly. To report a vehicle call the Mayor's Hotline, 444-5555.






